You can help at home by:

- Making comparisons between sizes such as shoe size / sock size.
- Get your child to help match up socks so they look closely at similarities and differences.
- Singing number rhymes
 (including in home language if this is not English)
- Talking about the changes that we see around us such as blossom on the trees and flowers growing.
- Talking to your child about the healthy choices you make at home such as brushing teeth, going to bed at a sensible time
- Encouraging your child to be as independent as possible with dressing.
- Looking for letters in the environment
- Having some regular screenfree time.
