Year 4 Summer I Curriculum Overview



As Effective Communicators...

We will read whole books and extracts from texts written for a variety of purposes. For example, this term we will be reading 'The Bluest of Blues'. We will focus on developing comprehension skills whilst identifying language and techniques used by the author, Fiona Robinson. We will write own texts across a variety of fiction and non-fiction genres with examples being found poetry, diary entries, non-chronological reports and character descriptions. This is in addition to developing technical skills in grammar, vocabulary with our current focus being paragraphs and Standard English.

As Mathematicians...

We will be focusing on understanding the part-whole relationship between numbers in relation to fractions. We will understand that a whole can be divided into equal or unequal parts and that the relative size of parts can be compared. We will be focusing on the relationship between improper fractions and mixed numbers and looking at how they can be placed on a number line. We will understand how to add and subtract improper fractions in the same way as proper fractions.


As Members of the Digital Age...

They will understand the work of William Morris and use this to create their very own pattern. Following this, they will apply their learning to creating printed fabrics in creative industries.

In outdoor PE we will be developing our striking and fielding skills which will lead to playing a game of cricket. In indoor PE we will be focusing on skills needed in agility games.
