Prayer and Reflection

The Gospel reading this weekend is from Matthew 22:1-10

Jesus again in reply spoke to the chief priests and elders of the people in parables, saying,

"The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who gave a wedding feast for his son. He dispatched his servants to summon the invited guests to the feast, but they refused to come. A second time he sent other servants, saying, 'Tell those invited: "Behold, I have prepared my banquet, my calves and fattened cattle are killed, and everything is ready; come to the feast." Some ignored the invitation and went away, one to his farm, another to his business. The rest laid hold of his servants, mistreated them, and killed them. The king was enraged and sent his troops,

destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. Then he said to his servants, 'The feast is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy to come. Go out, therefore, into the main roads and invite to the feast whomever you find.' The servants went out into the streets and gathered all they found, bad and good alike, and the hall was filled with guests."

Like the king in the Gospel, God sends out numerous invitations: friends who want you to join them at an event or activity, someone encouraging you, or someone recognising an act of kindness towards family or a neighbour. Each of these moments are invitations from God, challenging us to stretch beyond the comfortable, to live into the amazing life he has planned for each of us.

Let us pray that we are ready to accept God's invitation:

Gracious God, you welcome us to your heavenly banquet,

where we may celebrate your love and mercy. May we always open our door and welcome The stranger, the hungry and those in need. May our hearts be full of love and generosity For all we meet

Through Christ Our Lord, Amen.
