Remembrance Ceremony



Tomorrow at 11.00am, we will remember all of those in the armed forces who lost their lives during past and present wars. There will also be remembrance services around the country on Sunday, most notably the ceremony around the Cenotaph in London, where King Charles will lay a wreath.

To commemorate this day, our children held their own remembrance ceremony at the junior prayer garden, where they upheld two minutes of silence as well as placing a wreath of poppies at the foot of our Mary statue.

Prayer and Reflection

In the spring of 1915, shortly after losing a friend in Ypres, a Canadian doctor, Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae wrote his now famous poem after seeing poppies growing in battle-scarred fields. It was this poem which inspired the use of poppies as a symbol of remembrance for all those who have fallen in conflict.

In Flanders Fields by John McCrae

In Flanders' fields the poppies blow Between the crosses, row on row, That mark our place: and in the sky The larks, still bravely singing, fly Scarce heard amid the guns below. We are the dead. Short days ago We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow, Loved and were loved, and now we lie In Flanders' fields.

Take up our quarrel with the foe; To you from failing hands we throw The torch; be yours to hold it high, If ye break faith with us who die We shall not sleep, though poppies grow In Flanders' Fields.



Let us pray together:

Ever-living God, we remember those whom you have gathered from the storm of war into the peace of your presence; may that same peace calm our fears, bring justice to all peoples and establish harmony among the nations, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
