Prayer and Reflection

This week, on Friday 2nd February, we celebrate the feast of Candlemas. Candlemas primarily focuses on Jesus' early life. Many Christians believe that Jesus' mother Mary presented him to God at the Temple in Jerusalem after observing the traditional 40-day period of purification (of mothers) following his birth. According to a New Testament gospel, a Jewish man named Simeon held the baby in his arms and said that he would be a light for the Gentiles (Luke 2:32). It is for this reason that this event is called Candlemas.

Many Christians consider Jesus as the "light of the world" so it is fitting that candles are blessed on this day and that a candle-lit procession precedes the mass. The following prayer may be said at Candlemas:

Lord Jesus Christ,
You are the true Light
enlightening every soul born into this world.
Help us to realise,
this day and every day,
that our own humdrum daily work,
if it is done for love of You,
will shine brightly before You for all eternity.
Help us realise, too,



each time we see the blessed candles at Holy Mass,

that they are a symbol of Your Light shining in the darkness of this world.

Help us to live in that Light, to make it our own, and to kindle it in the souls of others,

Then we, too, working for You, shall be light-bearers who will help to spread Your kingdom on earth,

and increase the number of those who dwell in heaven, the city of eternal light. Amen.
